Dear Partners in Ministry,

At our congregation meeting on Feb. 12th, Suzanne Gillam, Bess Sproul, and myself each shared a brief verbal report of our ministry in 2016, and what is coming in 2017. After the meeting, Pastor John and I talked briefly, and he added something further. He said that if he were to have shared anything verbally, he would have said that this is a congregation that seems to have a lot of joy.

What a wonderful statement! After being with us for three months, I am thrilled that this has been Pastor John's experience of Good Shepherd. I pray that it is the experience of each of us and of newcomers as well.

Being a community of joy gets to the heart of who we are. We see this joy lived out when our small children sing out loudly, lending their voices to our worship. We see joy on Sunday mornings when eating cinnamon buns and talking with one another in the fellowship hall. We see joy at the laughter we share when eating around tables. We see joy at coming together as the body of Christ each Sunday to be reminded that we are beloved children of God, called to let our lights shine before others.

This month begins with Ash Wednesday on March 1st, leading us into the season of Lent. Often, we think of Lent as a somber time, a time for self-examination and repentance, a time where we try to leave behind the things

that draw us away from God. But, another way to think of Lent is as a path towards joy.

Certainly, joy comes on our celebrations on Easter morning. The trumpet resounds, proclaiming the joy of Christ's resurrection and victory over the cross and the grave. But, that joy does not need to come all at once on Easter. What if we saw Lent as a time when we were increasing our joy each day?

Now, this is not the joy of getting new toys on one's birthday. It is not the joy that material things may fleetingly provide. Rather, it is an internal joy, a deeper joy, a joy that comes from knowing that God is the only one who can fill us with true joy. It is the joy of realizing we do not need lots of money or lots of things to be content. It is the joy of giving of oneself, the joy of seeing one's own gifts provide for another person. It is the joy of doing away with our distractions, and allowing God's love to work its way into the empty spaces in our hearts.

St. Augustine famously wrote that "Our hearts are restless until they find their rest in God." Let us bring our restless hearts and embark on the Lenten road that leads to increasing joy, as individuals and as a congregation.

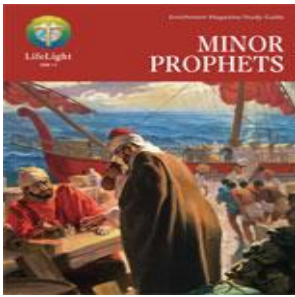

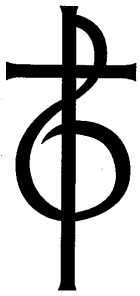

MUSIC MINISTRY NOTES



First I recently revisited an excellent book, **A Child Shall Lead: Children in Worship**. The editor, John Witvliet, is on the faculty at Calvin Theological Seminary in Grand Rapids, and has served on the board of directors for Choristers

Guild, an organization which specializes in children's choirs. In the book, many authors (from different denominations, but all of whom work with children's choir programs) reflect on the importance of children's full participation in worship. With their thoughts in my mind, I'd like to reflect on questions I have heard from adults, regarding children in worship at Good Shepherd.

"We have a nursery. Shouldn't those families with young children use it?"

Jesus welcomed the children! "Then little children were being brought to him in order that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples spoke sternly to those who had brought them, but Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." And he laid his hands on them and blessed them." *Matthew 19: 13-15*

Children learn much from being in worship, even at a very young age. We hear the voices of Blair and Lilian Gillin joining in with us on "And also with you!" and "Hear our prayer." And we know they are worshiping with us. One day last fall, Julie Hamilton Grant was helping with a mailing for the children's choirs, and Liam, age 2 ½, "escaped" from the room in which we were working. Julie followed him, and found him, in the sanctuary, taking the

offering plates forward to the chancel, as he had so many times observed the ushers doing. He understands, even at his age, something about the ritual that is worship. Please, if the children distract you momentarily in worship, rejoice in the knowledge that they are being included and welcomed in our midst, as Jesus himself welcomed children.

Should we clap for the children when they finish singing? Our focus in Grace Notes, Joyful Noise, and Midweek Singers is to help children participate fully in the worship service. They are learning to sing parts of the liturgy, including the Gospel Acclamation, and their anthems are related to the lectionary theme of the day. Whenever practical, they remain in the church service through the reading of the lessons, so they understand the connection between their song and the lessons for the day. We are teaching them that their role as Sunday Servants is to help illuminate the text, and bring a new perspective to the congregation, rather to perform, as in a concert. So it is more appropriate to thank them, as you would the Chancel Choir members, when you see them after the service, than to applaud.

I think I may have shared this poem by Brian Wren previously, but it is worth repeating:

When Children Pray

When children pray, please do not say,
"How nice!"

Remember Jesus cares,
and listens to our prayers.

When children speak, please do not say,
"How sweet!" and pat us on the head

Remember what we've said.

And when we sing, please do not say,
"How cute! It is so nice
to hear the children do their thing."

Look in our eyes.

We may be angels in disguise
Our singing voice may be God's choice.

We don't want you to miss
the Holy Spirit's kiss.

The things that children say and do
may be God's way of calling you.

Nurse's Notes

Happy March, happy almost spring, and
welcome to the season of Lent. During this
very busy part of the church year, there are
many other things also happening with the
Health Ministry and Parish nursing.

The Health ministry has set a date of March
19th to have the first session of practice with
the CPR manikins, the AED trainer, what to do
in an emergency, basic life support videos and
handouts. The classes will be held at 10 AM
and 12 noon. Plan for an hour of time for
hands on practice, learning or remembering
how to perform chest compressions, practicing
with the AED, with the goal of becoming more
familiar with what to do in an emergency. This
is an informational session, no cards will be
given out. But we will gauge if there is interest
in an actual Heart Saver class. Signup sheets



will be outside the parish nurse office, we are
limiting each class to ten attendees. If response
is overwhelming, we will plan a second Sunday
in the near future.

Blood pressure clinic will be starting up again.
For March, in order to accommodate First
Communion Sunday, I look forward to seeing
you on March 12th after the second service. If
anyone from the 7:45 service would like their
blood pressure done, I am happy to see you
right after service. And any other Sunday, I can
do a blood pressure reading if you have a
concern.

And lastly, this is no joke, our spring blood
drive will be held on April 1st. Every day the
need for red blood cells, and blood products
derived from donations is critical. Cancer
patients, surgical patients, accident victims are
all recipients of your gift of life. Can't donate?
You can still help out by manning the
admission table or volunteering for the
canteen. The drive runs from 9 am – 2 pm, and
a sign up will be available soon through a link
in the weekly on line newsletter, as well as
signing up for donating blood at the American
Red Cross website. I've done the pre-
registration in the past, it takes about ten
minutes, and you get to bypass the book and a
lot of computer time when you come in to
donate. The Health Ministry is sponsoring the
drive and the Dunkin Donut gift cards as a
thank you. Hope to see you there!
