Dear Partners in Ministry,

As spring weather finally(!) arrived this month, I've taken to walking to Good Shepherd when I can, usually accompanied by Zin (who is only too happy to act as a one-dog welcoming committee for the parish office). This time has come with unexpected gifts—the chance to meet new people, to think, and to pray. Often my prayers come out as hymns, and this morning as I walked, the one that kept coming to mind was an African-American spiritual, "Guide My Feet."

Guide my feet, while I run this race...for I don't want to run this race in vain!

It's a heartfelt plea set to an upbeat melody, and as a prayer, it's never been very far from my heart during these past few months of discernment and transition. You know as well as I do that discernment isn't easy, and that this prayer is its refrain: prayer that God guides our feet, and that God's will is the one that gets done.

With this hymn-prayer still in my head this morning, I reviewed the scripture readings for this weekend's installation, and these words from Isaiah jumped out at me:

"I am the Lord, I have called you in righteousness,
I have taken you by the hand and kept you;
I have given you as a covenant to the people,
a light to the nations,
to open the eyes that are blind,
to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon,
from the prison those who sit in
darkness." (Isaiah 42:6-7)

This morning, these words struck me as a prophetic answer to that hymn-prayer. They offer profound reassurance that the call we have discerned together comes from God, and that the God who gives it is one whose presence never fails, who never lets go of our hand, who has intentions for us and for people we haven't even met yet—intentions for illumination and liberation!

I've already seen the ways that Good Shepherd is living into Isaiah's holy vision and have already found joy in this first month here to be running this race with you. I feel particularly blessed to have arrived among you at a time when your leadership is once again lifting Good Shepherd's mission statement to "Grow, Make, and Nurture Disciples in Christ" up to the light, and discover anew a fresh meaning for us in this time and place. I hope many of you will make time on Saturday, June 23rd from 8:45a-12p to come workshop our mission statement together and add your voices to that ongoing discernment. (I'm going to be visiting family that weekend but am excited that I'll have the fruits of that meeting to come back to! The job our consultant gave to me, as a fresh pair of eyes, is to be a good student and asker of questions as we do this work.) In the meantime, I look forward to getting to know each of you better over the coming months and years. I'm grateful for the wonderful hospitality I've received from you so far (especially those nametags!), and already feel such joy in joining the race that God has

set before you—now, before *us!* May God continue to guide our feet—we don't want to run this race in vain!

Sisters and brothers of Good Shepherd:

Our New Horizons program is off to a great start. *We have currently raised \$107,250 and on our way to meeting our goal of \$500,000.*

Some questions that have come up during our conversations so far are:

What are you going to do with the money raised if pledges do not end until December 2020?

All money donated to New Horizons will be sent to Thrivent Financial to pay down our mortgage principle within 30 days of receipt whenever possible. We will get an immediate payback on your contributions. We will re-amortize our mortgage as needed throughout the year, so our payment will be reduced.

Are you going to apply all funds directly to the principle or lower the term of the mortgage?

It is our intent to apply all funds to reduce our principle. Once the program is over Church Council will make the decision to continue the mortgage term as it is or to reduce the length of the loan based on our financial condition at the time.

We will release a series of Cottage Meetings soon which we hope you will attend so we can answer any questions you may have. Please sign up for a time that suits you best!

It bothers me when I hear, "What will we do without Bess?" I am leaving, but I am not taking these wonderful musicians with me. Good Shepherd is truly blessed with musical talent, and the next music director and organist will be truly blessed to be here, just as I have been blessed.

Bibles will be presented to all second graders and older students new to Good Shepherd who are in attendance. Those who are not in attendance will receive

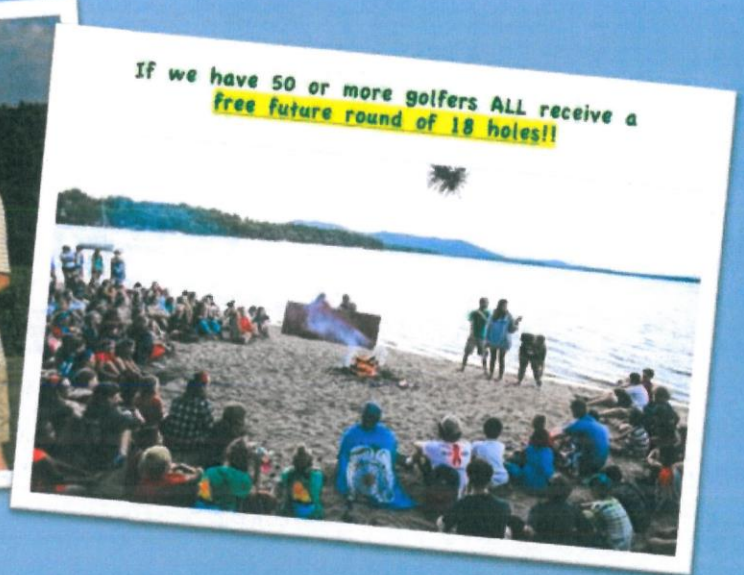
theirs at our Rally Day Service in September. All of our children's choirs will be adding their voices and chimes to the service.

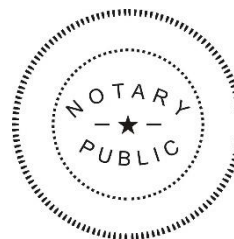
