



## MESSENGER May 2018

Dear Partners in Ministry,

In this Easter season, I have been consistently pondering and praying this question – what does resurrection look like? Another way of asking that is where are we sensing God’s presence in our shared life together? One of the benefits of serving as pastor at Good Shepherd is getting to see the full scope of our ministries. Here are some of the many places that I am seeing resurrection and God at work through all of us:

- Pastor Larson’s beginning on May 1<sup>st</sup> was preceded by a whole crew of GSLC people helping to move her in to her apartment on April 16<sup>th</sup> (Patriots Day). You may remember, that day was full of cold temperatures, high winds, and LOTS of rain. Yet still, a crew of 20 to 25 people braved the elements and moved her in. It included some of our children, some of our elders, and everything in between.
- Approximately 20 first year Confirmation students shared their final projects, surrounded by the witness of loving parents and family members. These have been on display in the fellowship hall over the last few Sundays.
- Over the April vacation week, about 60 people from central MA gathered to hear Bishop Hazelwood’s talk on “Lands and People of the Bible.” The night of fellowship and learning that comes through time spent planning, cooking, preparing, and finally eating together was a highlight of 2018. Almost \$1800 was also raised to support scholarships for students in the schools of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL).
- 16 of our high school youth plus three adults continue to plan for the ELCA Youth Gathering trip to Houston at the end of June. We continue to pray for God’s spirit to lead us into deeper faith through this trip where we’ll join with 30,000 other Lutherans to learn, serve, and worship. It will be a very different experience of what it means to be a part of the body of Christ than our regular Sunday morning worship services!
- A dedicated team of people has been meeting to plan a major debt reduction campaign within the congregation. Imagine the doors that could be opened for our ministry if we were able to significantly reduce our monthly mortgage payments! Not to mention the money that would be saved that otherwise would go towards paying interest on a loan.

- Other dedicated individuals continue to serve through Council meetings, Ministry Cabinet meetings, specific ministry committee meetings, the Christian Education Director search team, the Music Director search team, and many more!
- The fact that most Sundays over the past two months, there have been newcomers visiting the congregation for worship and/or educational programs. If you see a face you don't recognize, please introduce yourself!

I pray that you are sensing the places God is bringing about resurrection in your life, and that you are seeing and sensing the ways it is happening in the life of Good Shepherd too.

### **MUSIC MINISTRY NOTES**

**Psalm 98 begins: "Sing a new song to the Lord!"** In the past few weeks, and in the weeks to come, we have been, and will be, exploring some new songs in the traditional services at 7:45 and 9:00. Poets and composers are inspired to pray and to praise the Lord, and it is good for us to learn to sing their songs. Everything that is old, and familiar, and favorite, was once new, so I encourage you to be brave and try the new.

Pastor Jeff has often chosen hymns with texts by Carolyn Winfrey Gillette. She is a graduate of the Princeton Seminary, and pastor of a Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia. She is a prolific writer of hymn texts, and follows the lectionary very carefully, so her texts are closely related to the lessons of the day. She also has written texts in response to national tragedies and even hurricanes. She usually uses familiar tunes, so we can weave them easily into our services.

On **April 29**, we sang "**God, You Make All Water Holy,**" a song that was composed by Mark Mummert, Cantor at Trinity Lutheran Church in Worcester, for the Ecumenical Institute of Liturgical Studies, held in April at Valparaiso University. He set to music a text by hymnist Ruth Duck, a pastor in the United Church of Christ, and Professor of Worship at Garrett-Evangelical Seminary. She has written over 200 texts for hymns, some of which are in our ELW. The baptismal text was particularly appropriate for that day, as the lesson from Acts talked about baptism, and Alexander Gillin was baptized at the 9:00 service.

On **May 6**, we will welcome Pastor Victoria Larson with "**God Has Called Us.**" The text is by Susan Cherwein, and music by her husband, David Cherwein. They are Lutheran writers who have each made significant contributions to anthems and hymns. David Cherwein directs the National Lutheran Choir, based in Minneapolis/St. Paul, Minnesota.

On **May 13**, we will be turning to a song that was once new, but has become familiar to us. We have changed it to make it our own. We will sing the African song, "**Siyahamba,**" but instead of "Marching in the Light of God", our

children will be "Hopping in the Light of God" for World Hunger. This is always great fun!

**May 20** is Pentecost, so be sure to wear red! Our traditional services will have wonderful hymns to the Holy Spirit, and our 10:45 service will be the service of Confirmation for our second year Confirmation students. We look forward to celebrating with them and their families.

**May 27** is Holy Trinity Sunday. I'm not sure if there will be a new hymn that day, but you can be sure we will sing "Holy, Holy, Holy"! On that day, we change our worship schedule from three to two services. The traditional service will be at 8:30, and contemporary service at 10:15 throughout the summer months.

Blessings to you as the daffodils and forsythia have finally arrived!

We will be helping with the planting in the fields, so dress appropriately.



Midweek 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> graders will offer the sermon.




Bibles will be presented to all second graders and older students new to Good Shepherd who are in attendance. Those who are not in attendance will receive theirs at our Rally Day Service in September.


