ministry together with you!

**September 13<sup>th</sup>: "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday**



Across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, the second Sunday of September is "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday. Congregations throughout the ELCA are encouraged to go out into their communities for a day of service, putting love into action for the sake of our neighbors.

We encourage each member of Good Shepherd to find a way to engage with this call to service in a way that works for your circumstances, whether it's finding a pen pal in a nursing home or a child to whom you can read over a Zoom call or a neighbor whose lawn you can mow. You are also invited to participate in our congregational activity: a backpack drive for Gibbons Middle School. Please bring your donations to the church and drop them off in the pink tote outside the front doors. Our goal is to assemble 20 sets that each contain:

- 1 backpack
- 2 spiral notebooks
- 2 composition notebooks
- 3 pocket folders
- #2 pencils
- Pens (black or blue)
- A pencil pouch
- 2 highlighters
- Pack of index cards (100 count)

- Hand sanitizer
- Masks

Ideally these items should be gender-neutral. Please drop them off at the church by the evening of Saturday, September 12<sup>th</sup>. Want to check on what we need? Check on the state of our [Sign-Up sheet](#). On Sunday, we invite those who attend our 8:30 parking lot service to stay after worship and help us assemble kits.

One or two other school-related service projects may be offered on Sunday, September 13<sup>th</sup>. Please keep your eyes on the weekly news!

Our worship will include a blessing of the learning community, and adult education classes and children's Sunday School will begin that day. **[12-1pm:** Children's Special Learning Series \*]


\*for example, 4<sup>th</sup> graders will get to learn about Lutheran history on Sundays in October. See the update from our Christian Education Director for more details!

We also intend to structure many of our offerings to be available digitally, so even if we can't gather in-person, there will still be ways for us to live together into our mission to grow, nurture, and make disciples in Christ.

### **COUNCIL NOTES**

On Tuesday, August 11th, the Council held their regular monthly meeting. This was a virtual Zoom meeting due to the pandemic.

After opening devotions, where we focused on “our WHY,” we briefly discussed our financial position. Joann was out of town, so we decided to table the financial discussion until we could talk with her more in depth. We then quickly approved the minutes from the previous Council meetings.

Council also discussed that repairs to the side entries to the church that have been completed through a generous gift from a member. Pastor Jeff reported that the work looks great but there is additional stone work that needs to be done to repair some crumbling walls. A motion was passed to authorize Steve Brevik to spend up to \$1200 to hire someone to complete those repairs.

Pastor Larson presented an update on the Reopening Committee progress. A communication will be going out to the Congregation explaining the plans, as follows:

- With a few small tweaks, we intend to continue offering communion as part of our outdoors worship.

- At the same time, we want to emphasize; *if anyone would like to receive communion and does not feel comfortable attending the outdoor service, please let the church office or the pastors know. We are confident that we can find a safe, socially distanced way to offer communion to all who would like to receive it.*
- Beginning August 16<sup>th</sup>, we plan to have the sanctuary open for prayer each Sunday morning from 8 AM to 12 noon. Anyone is welcome to come by the church during those hours and pray who is not under quarantine or experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19. If you do come, we expect you to wear a mask and maintain six feet of distance from anyone else who may be present. In addition, we ask that you not linger in the space after you are done. (All known evidence about transmission of the virus points to an increased risk the longer people remain in indoor, enclosed spaces with other people.)
- We have set up a sign-in sheet at the front entrance for anyone with a key to the building. If you happen to be in the church for any purpose, please wear a mask and mark on the sheet where you have been. This will help our sexton Steve Brevik to know the areas and surfaces that need to be cleaned and disinfected.
- We acknowledge that as a congregation, we hold a diversity of viewpoints about how we should be gathering right now. Some of us feel we should be worshipping indoors. Others have said they will not attend until there is a vaccine and the pandemic is over. Many more are somewhere in the middle. Our approach has been to take measured, gradual steps in gathering for worship and opening the church building. At this point, we believe it is best to continue with the outdoor worship services for as long as the weather permits. In the meantime, we remain committed to hearing people's feedback and doing what we can to accommodate people's spiritual needs while also honoring the safety of all.

If you have feedback to share, please do not hesitate to reach out to anyone on the re-opening team!

The Council is very appreciative of all the work that the Reopening Committee is doing. If you have a chance, please thank Kim Brennan, Bob Frederico, Garrick Grant, Jochen Salfeld and Joan Olson.

Following this discussion, we started talking about the upcoming Congregation Annual Meeting in November. We confirmed that our Constitution does NOT prohibit virtual meetings, so for now, that is our plan. We will continue to discuss this at future Council meetings.

The Council then took some time to focus on our pre-pandemic goals for the year and our Epiphany “Star Words.” We found that our goals are as relevant as ever in this pandemic world we find ourselves in. Our goals are:

- Strengthen personal connections
- Keep our mission statement in front of us
- Cultivate active listening and transparent communication and decision making.

And our star words included transformation, play, passion, heal, build, joy, confidence and strength. It was fun to take some time to see how all of these words and concepts come into play as we try to navigate through the pandemic.

Finally, we spent some time discussing feedback received from members of the Congregation. One item was a question as to whether Council meetings are closed to members. The answer to that is an emphatic no- Council meetings are open to anyone who wants to attend. During the pandemic, it is challenging because we are meeting via Zoom. But we can still accommodate anyone who wants to join the Council meetings- they just need to call the office or Pastors to get the Zoom dial-in information. Council meetings are always the second Tuesday of the month. Another topic of the feedback received was the impression that Good Shepherd is becoming too political. Council had varying different opinions about this and noted that we recently decided to turn down a member’s offer to put a Black Lives Matter sign out front precisely because we felt that would be too political. Instead we wanted to focus on a theme of loving all, respecting all, and welcoming all; and we tasked the RIC Committee to build on that theme. This topic of whether Good Shepherd is becoming too political is important and Council plans to spend more time drilling into and discussing it.

As always, we welcome any thoughts, questions or feedback you may have.





## **ADULT FORUM – STARTING 9/20/20. NEW TIME SUNDAYS AT 11:15 A.M.**



“Called to Hear”: A study guide to the ELCA social statement, “The Church and Criminal Justice: Hearing the Cries”

Given the attention to issues raised by the Black Lives Matter movement concerning policing and racial injustice, our first topic will be the ELCA’s social statement about the criminal justice system. We will use the ELCA’s study guide “Called to Hear” to explore these issues from a Christian perspective. Below is a brief course description.

Four S’s describe the study of the ELCA social statement on criminal justice —

**Statistics, Stories, Scripture and Strategies.** We begin with a review of the statistics, and they certainly give participants pause. The numbers of incarcerated individuals in the United States are staggering; the abuses against people of color and those living in poverty are daunting.

While the study centers on the topic of criminal justice and gives participants a good grounding of our church’s stances on the topic, the study also serves as a bit of a refresher course on faith issues. Many of the key words we use in talking about our faith: sin, grace, justice, brokenness, redemption, reconciliation, forgiveness, law-and-gospel. All get explored here in down-to-earth ways. Therefore this study carries us to the heart of what we believe about God and relationships, and to what better place could God call us?!

1. Hearing the Call: Why are we called to care about our broken criminal justice system?
2. Hearing the Voices: Who is crying out?
3. Hearing God’s Call for Justice: How does God guide us to seek justice?
4. Hearing How to Respond Wisely: What are some models of ministry?
5. Hearing How to Make a Difference: How can we advocate for change?

We will use Zoom to show the videos and “handouts” for all participants until we resume meeting in the church. Mark Booher and Jochen Salfeld will facilitate. Join us Sundays at 11:15 a.m. starting 9/20/20. You are welcome for only one or all the sessions.


